The **Executive Committee** is composed of the four officers of the Board of Directors. It is this committee's function to call meetings of the Board, plan for the Foundation, and be responsible for the financial management of the Foundation's funds including investment and allocation of the funds for distribution by the Disbursement and Allocations Committee. The committee allocates funds to a general endowment fund, a restricted fund, or an unrestricted fund. Some of these allocations are

determined by the donor; however, where there are options available, the Executive Committee makes the recommendation.

The **Community Relations and Development Committee** is responsible for fund raising activities, marketing, alumni relations, and media relations. The committee plans fund raising that includes receipt of gifts from individuals/alumni, corporations/businesses, as well as other foundations.

The **Distribution and Allocation Committee** is responsible for making recommendations to the Board regarding specific disbursements as provide Secondary Article Heading provided through general guidance from the Executive Committee. Disbursements include student scholarships, staff development activities, capital requests (building and/or equipment), and program support.

Computer**

The Macintosh G3 computer which Educational Horizons helped to purchase for the Art program has been getting daily use.

The fifth grades at Koenig have recently completed a major collaborative multi-media unit in poetry which introduced them to HyperStudio and computer animation. The art room computer was used to assemble and evaluate their work, and for individual instruction outside of class.

The fourth grades also did a multi-disciplinary unit on Wisconsin history using Kid Pix. This was graded and assembled into a slide show on the art room computer. The project was then transferred to their teacher's

electronic folder so the student work could be accessed on any machine in the computer lab. The new computer made it possible to process and assemble these large files from the art room.

When the third grades recently did an oil pastel portrait of a clown, as part of the introduction to the unit, I told the story of Emmett Kelly. We then used the art room computer to go to a web site where we could see his picture and those of other circus clowns.

When we did a second grade unit on migrating geese, we went to the Internet to find a quick time movie of a goose in flight. The kids watched it closely to study the anatomy and markings as they

worked on their projects. These types of uses will be incorporated into many lessons.

The art room G3 is also used for e-mail within the district and with teachers in other districts. It has been a research tool for lesson plans and educational resources, and the word processor is used constantly in my duties as department head. I have also loaded Adobe Illustrator onto it so I can learn this industry standard drawing program. My old machine could not run Illustrator.

The art program has greatly benefitted from Educational Horizon's generosity.
